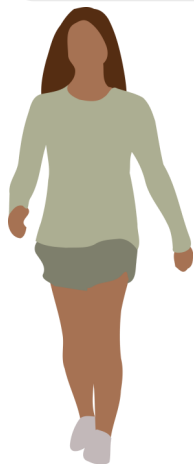

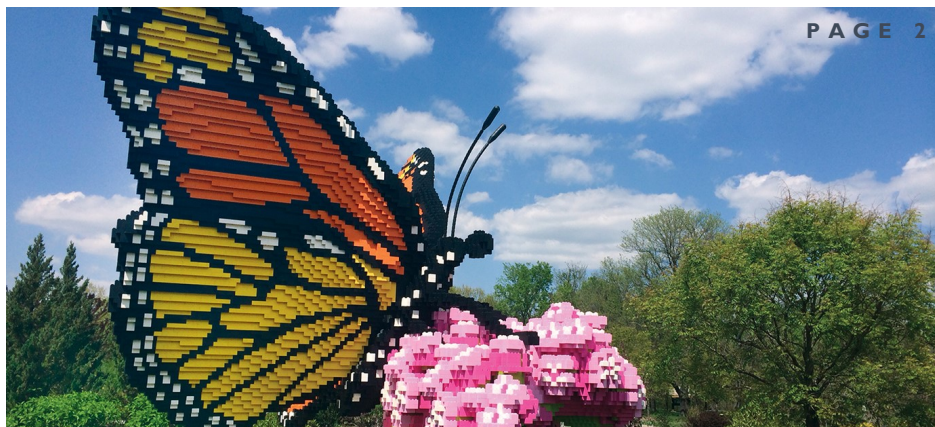

CISMCC is part of a nationwide network of Communities in Schools affiliates—one of a very small number of dropout-prevention programs in the country proven to keep students in school and is *the only dropout prevention program in the nation with research to prove that it increases graduation rates.*

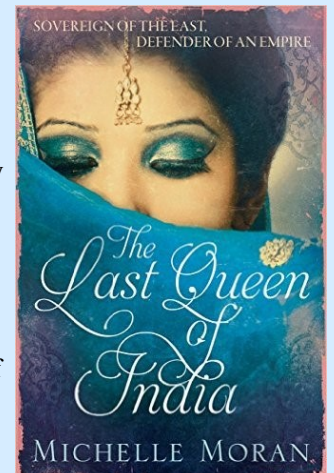
